Cost of Cybersecurity

The World Economic Forum's 2018 Global Risks Report ranks both large-scale cyberattacks and major data breaches or fraud among the top five most likely risks in the next decade



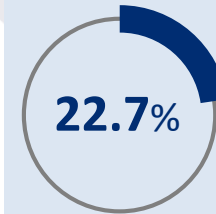
\$600 Billion

That's what Cybercrime costs the world, or 0.8 percent of global GDP¹

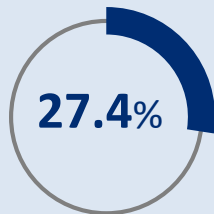


\$1 Trillion

Latam Connectivity Characteristics



653 million inhabitants⁴

Large and heterogeneous region, which countries are economically, culturally, linguistically, and socioeconomically diverse.



Many countries in the region do not have strong networks of cybersecurity professionals or robust cybersecurity education programs.



In terms of Internet users, these are percentages of penetration rate: Ecuador 81%, Argentina 78,6%, Chile 77%, Brazil 65,9%, México 65,3%, Venezuela 60% and Colombia 58,1%. ⁵



Communication using the chat application WhatsApp is prevalent throughout Latin America.



Low levels of security awareness both among the public and law enforcement in Latin America.

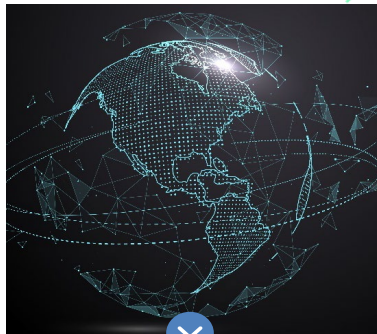


Typically lags behind most of the rest of the world in terms of cybercrime sophistication.

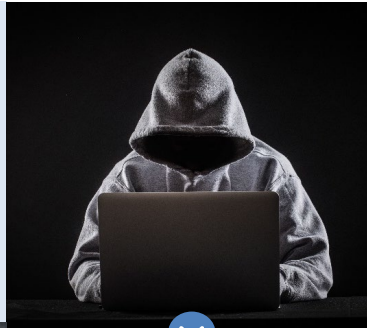
